ORDER VACATING JULY 30, 2021 COVID-19 MASK ORDER

On July 30, 2021, the undersigned entered a COVID-19 Order requiring

every person age four or over to wear a mask to enter a United States

courthouse within the Middle District of Florida. In light of the current COVID

situation and in consultation with the Court's COVID Committee, the July 30,

2021 COVID-19 Order (Doc. 4) is VACATED. Masks are no longer required

to be worn by visitors or employees in Middle District of Florida courthouses.

However, the presiding judge retains discretion to require masks in a court

proceeding, and anyone who wishes to wear a mask in a courthouse may

continue to do so.
