Reset CM/ECF Password

Active members with the Middle District of Florida may auto-retrieve a reset CM/ECF password. The auto-retrieve password feature will not work for federal government lawyers or lawyers granted special admission (pro hac vice). Follow the steps below to complete the reset password process.

Auto-Retrieve Reset CM/ECF Password

 On the "Reset Your CM/ECF Password" page or the "Forgot Login/Password Link," enter your Middle District of Florida CM/ECF Login ID and click Submit. Your Login ID is your first initial, last name, and seven-digit Florida Bar Number. If your Florida Bar Number is fewer than seven-digits, add leading zeros; for example, jdoe0034567.



2. You will receive an e-mail with "FLMD CM/ECF Password Reset Request" as the Subject line. Click the URL to reset your password. E-mail example below:
