Position Overview

The career law clerk researches criminal and civil issues, writes extensively, attends and assists with court proceedings, and acts as an advisor by making recommendations to the Honorable Christopher P. Tuite, United States Magistrate Judge. The caseload in the jurisdiction is heavy, and the types of filings are varied, often involving novel legal questions. While the nature of the criminal and civil litigation is serious, the office environment is personable and inclusive. There is daily interaction with the Judge and other law clerks and staff concerning legal and court-related matters.

Minimum Qualifications

The applicant must must have post-law school experience in a litigation practice and/or a prior clerkship, must possess excellent research and writing skills, and must work well both independently and collaboratively. Prior membership on a law review editorial board or publication of noteworthy articles is preferred but not required. Good character, maturity, and a willingness to work long hours and under deadlines are also required. Applicants must be a U.S. citizen or eligible to work in the United States. The selected candidate will be subject to a background check as a condition of employment.

Other Information

Employment with the United States District Court offers a generous benefit package, civil and criminal law experience at the federal court level, and an environment providing significant responsibility and challenge. Visit OPM.gov for more information about available benefits and eligibility.

Starting salary will be commensurate with work experience and prior pay history. Salary may be higher with previous experience as a law clerk to a federal judge. The elected candidate will be subject to a background check as a condition of employment.

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
