ORDER

Section 753(f), Title 28 of the United States Code authorizes a district court to prescribe fees for court reporter transcripts at rates approved by the Judicial Conference of the United States. At a March 2018 meeting, the Judicial Conference amended the schedule of maximum rates to add a “3-day transcript” delivery category, which is defined as “a transcript to be delivered within three (3) calendar days after receipt of an order.”

For a transcript ordered on or after **April 6, 2018**, a court reporter serving the Middle District of Florida is authorized to charge the following “per page” rates:

Transcript Delivery Category	Original	First Copy to Each Party	Each Additional Copy to the Same Party
Ordinary transcript (30 day)	\$3.65	\$0.90	\$0.60
14-day transcript	\$4.25	\$0.90	\$0.60
Expedited transcript (7 day)	\$4.85	\$0.90	\$0.60
3-day transcript	\$5.45	\$1.05	\$0.75
Daily transcript	\$6.05	\$1.20	\$0.90
Hourly transcript (2 hours)	\$7.25	\$1.20	\$0.90

Realtime transcript	One feed, \$3.05; two to four feeds, \$2.10; five or more feeds, \$1.50. A "feed" is the electronic data flow from the court reporter to the computer of each person or party ordering and receiving the realtime transcription in the courtroom.
